

Talk to your Neighbors about the Upcoming Election

Did you know that the entire General Assembly is up for election in November of 2023? Yes, all 100 seats of the House of Delegates and 40 seats of the Senate are in play this November.

Did you know that in off-year elections such as this one – meaning that it's not a presidential race, nor is the governor on the ballot – that as few as 28-42% of registered voters turn out to vote? As a representative government, our elected officials should represent more than 28% of the people when making and passing laws that impact 100% of the constituency.

Did you know that it takes about an hour to become a registrar? By becoming a registrar, you can help the homebound, the elderly, and those otherwise unable to get to their voting precincts to make sure their vote is counted. Did you know that with this upcoming election, the citizens of Virginia will be voting in the new district boundaries? Yes, every House and Senate district has been redrawn and this election will decide who will represent you in 2024.

Did you know that 30% of the House of Delegates and 25% of the Senate will be <u>new</u> to the General Assembly because of this election? Yes, between the change in districts, those running for other seats and those choosing not to run again, there will be a considerable opportunity for changing the dynamics in both chambers.

Did you know that citizens can affect the process of law-making by more than just voting? Voting is not the only critical element of passing laws that support and protect citizens. As constituents of these elected officials, we can visit them at their offices (locally and in Richmond), we can contact them and encourage them to support and pass bills that are good for society, we can continue to build relationships and encourage others to do the same by reminding our representatives who they represent!
